#### 5 Legal powers

5.1. Section 248 of the Greater London Authority Act 1999 places upon London TravelWatch (as the London Transport Users Committee) a duty to consider - and where it appears to the Committee to be desirable, to make recommendations with respect to - any matter affecting the functions of the Greater London Authority or Transport for London which relate to transport (other than of freight). Section 252A of the same Act (as amended by Schedule 6 of the Railways Act 2005) places a similar duty upon the Committee to keep under review matters affecting the interests of the public in relation to railway passenger and station services provided wholly or partly within the London railway area, and to make representations about them to such persons as it thinks appropriate.

#### Annex B

#### Hidden disabilities card

Transport for London reported on 15 December 2010:

"Transport for London can confirm that a Travel Support Card was trialled, targeting people with invisible disabilities, particularly those with learning disabilities. The trial ran for six months at three separate interchanges: Stratford, Willesden Junction and Wimbledon. We sent out over three hundred cards to individuals and groups. We provided the individuals participating in the trial with feedback forms, asking them to fill them in on occasions when they needed to use the card. We also contacted the groups taking part and requested more general feedback about the principle. In addition, London Underground and London Overground staff were canvassed for their views on the initiative.

We are currently evaluating the results of the trial. Once this assessment has been carried out we will be in a position to decide if a wider roll-out is desirable."
